Patrimoine Sourd (Deaf Heritage), By Yves Delaporte. Published by the French-language journal. Culture et Langue des Signes (CLSFB), #33, 24 pages, 2010. This French language booklet on the culture and sign language in deafness is a product

of a French association named in honor of Ferdinand Berthier (1803-86), a famous 19th -century pioneer who assisted the deaf in France. The booklet depicts and describes more than 70 stamps relating to deafness, including images of more than a dozen pioneers. One of the most noteworthy pioneers is Abbe Charles Michel de L'Epee (1712-98), who is considered

The theme for sign language is used as the design for stamps of Barbados, Demmark, Great Britain, Poland, Spain, Yugoslavia and the United States.
